**Course description**

The ASHEPP (Apply SHE Principles and Procedures) course aims to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of Safety, Health, and Environmental (SHE) principles, procedures, and best practices. It focuses on promoting a culture of safety, health, and environmental responsibility in the workplace and ensuring compliance with regulations and corrective actions where necessary.

**Course outcome**

Students will be able to:

- Explaining the safety, health and environmental requirements applicable in a specific workplace.
- Monitoring workplace compliance to safety, health and environmental requirements against specified requirements.
- Evaluating performance of workplace safety activities required by safety, health and environmental management programmes.
- Remedying workplace non-compliance to and non-performance of safety, health and environmental requirements and programmes.

**MODULE 1: EXPLAIN THE SHE REQUIREMENTS APPLICABLE IN A SPECIFIC WORKPLACE.**

Applicable SHE requirements.  
 The impact of the SHE requirements.  
 Compliance to workplace SHE principles.  
 Purpose of monitoring compliance to SHE requirements.  
 The requirements to monitor workplace SHE compliance.  
 Integrating SHE considerations in all routine activities.

**MODULE 2: MONITOR WORKPLACE COMPLIANCE TO SHE REQUIREMENTS**

The specified requirements for monitoring workplace compliance to SHE requirements.  
 Purpose and extent of monitoring workplace compliance.  
 Human resources, tools, instruments, equipment and material Resources required for monitoring.  
 Identifying and recording SHE compliance deviations.

**MODULE 3: EVALUATE PERFORMANCE OF ACTIVITIES SHE MANAGEMENT PROGRAMMES**

Safety performance is measured against established objectives.  
 The tools and techniques used to measure workplace SHE performance.  
 Analyse and evaluate the identified / reported workplace SHE incidents.  
 Critical workplace areas are identified and accessed through available sources.  
 The importance of evaluating workplace SHE performance.  
 Cleaning and storage of measuring equipment.  
 The grading of various industrial processes to impact on environmental receptors.

**MODULE 4: REMEDY WORKPLACE SHE NON-COMPLIANCE TO AND NON-PERFORMANCE**

Reports are completed in the required formats and submitted to relevant designated persons on time.  
 The right to refuse to work, discontinuing of work and withdrawal procedures under circumstances that pose a serious danger to health or safety.  
 Deviations from requirements in SHE management programmes.  
 Remedial action required to deal with identified hazards and in terms of the consequences for SHE and productivity.  
 Expectations and contributions of stakeholders during the evaluation of SHE management programmes.  
 Feedback regarding the progress and results of SHE management programmes.
